The Rainsville City Council met in Regular Session on November 2, 2015, at the Rainsville Agri-Business Center with the following members present: Mayor—Nick Jones. Council Members—Joey Graham, David Holt, Melissa Ledbetter, Brandon Freeman, and Rodger Lingerfelt.

Mayor Jones called the meeting to order and called the roll.

A motion was made by Graham and seconded by Ledbetter to approve and dispense with the reading of the minutes. **Motion carried with all in favor.**

Item #1. A motion was made by Freeman and seconded by Lingerfelt to build a 40 x 80 building structure at the Field of Dreams. **Motion carried with all in favor.**

Item #2. A motion was made by Lingerfelt and seconded by Freeman **TO PASS AND ADOPT RESOLUTION 11-02-2015 NAMING AND DEDICATING THE STREET CONNECTING DILBECK TO MARSHALL ROAD CAREY BAKER LANE IN HONOR OF HIS DEDICATION AND SERVICE TO THE CITY OF RAINSVILLE. Motion carried with all in favor.**

Councilman Graham announced Police Chief Charles Centers retirement effective February 2, 2016. He also announced that they would be posting the Police Chief Position internally for seven days, and then to the public for fourteen days in the near future.

Council member Rodger Lingerfelt brought the Weekly Post Renovation Contract up for discussion. When asked why the contract had not been signed after it was passed by the majority vote, Mayor Jones stated that he would not sign items that he was opposed to because he felt like he would be held liable if he signed off on them.
